Billings Public Schools Trustee Vacancy Information

The Board of Trustees of Billings Public Schools has declared a trustee vacancy in Trustee Zone 5, effective October 15, 2018. Applications to fill the vacancy are being accepted through 4 p.m. November 9, 2018.

Eligibility to Fill Vacancy

Persons eligible to be appointed to fill the vacancy must:

- 1. Be a registered voter in Yellowstone County, AND
- 2. Have lived in Trustee Zone 5 since at least October 15, 2017, one year prior to the effective date of the vacancy.

The boundaries of Trustee Zone 5 are shown on the attached "Trustee Boundary Map."

Length of Term to Be Served

The individual appointed by the board to fill the vacancy is authorized to serve on the board until the next regularly scheduled trustee election in May 2019. The appointee will then have to run for election on May 7, 2019 for a three year term if they intend to continue serving as a trustee.

How to Apply to Fill Vacancy

To apply for the vacant trustee position, you must submit all of the following to the District Clerk in person, by email, or by fax 4 p.m. on November 9, 2018.

- 1. A letter of interest to the Board of Trustees
- 2. Current resume with at least three (3) reference
- 3. Answers to the attached "Trustee Vacancy Applicant Questions"
