

Hello Wolfpack Family!

We made it!!! In August, we were hoping to make it for a month of in person learning. Now, here we are, successfully completing the entire school year. Thank you for your support, patience and determination, making this possible for our students!

With restrictions still in place, students will receive their awards at the end of the year in small group settings. Medicine Crow 6th, 7th and 8th graders will receive their Power of the Pack certificates. This is a participation award earned by active involvement in a combination of clubs, honor roll and sports. The goal is to encourage students to be involved in student life at MCMS. Students will receive a certificate this spring; in the fall when they return, they will be given an official Power of the Pack card. You are probably wondering why the cards aren't given out this spring.

Simple! We want to make sure the cards do not get lost between now and fall:-) For 8th grade, Power of the Pack winners will receive a certificate and a Skyview lanyard to send them off to their freshman year. Students who earned Power of the Pack honors are listed at the end of the newsletter.

6th GRADE PARENTS

The State of Montana has immunization requirements for all students entering the 7th Grade. All incoming 7th Graders must have a Tdap booster immunization. If you are not sure if your child has received the Tdap booster, please feel free to call the office. If you have proof of the Tdap booster, please bring the record to the office and we will make a copy for our records.

Immunizations are given at Riverstone Health Immunization Clinic at 123 S. 27th Street, Mondays and Fridays from 1:00 pm-4:30 pm and on Wednesdays from 11:00 am-6:30 pm or you can make an appointment with their doctor. We are also lucky to have the convenience of having the Riverstone Clinic at Medicine Crow. Please call 247-3210 to make an appointment.

Please bring a copy of your child's immunization card to the school for verification after getting their shots. Thank you for your assistance.

CASA VOLUNTEERS

The success of our future depends on the well-being of our children, but in Montana they are among the most vulnerable in our communities. Statewide, the number of children entering foster care due to abuse or neglect in recent years has skyrocketed. In Yellowstone County, the number of children removed from their home has increased drastically from 182 in 2014 to nearly 600 in 2017, resulting in approximately 1,000 children currently in Foster Care. Despite the enormity of these statistics, our children are more than numbers, and each one deserves a voice. You could be that voice by becoming a volunteer Court Appointed Special Advocate, with CASA of Yellowstone County. SUMMER HOURS FOR THE RIVERSTONE MEDICINE CROW CLINIC

Hours of operation for the summer are as follows:

- Mondays and Fridays: 1:00 pm 5:00 pm
- Tuesdays and Thursdays: 8:00 am 12:00 Noon and 1:00 pm 5:00 pm

The Riverstone Clinic at Medicine Crow School will also be open this summer for their behavioral health services. You may schedule appointments with the Behavioral Health Providers, Brandi McFerran LCSW and Diane Hurd NP at 247-3210.

They will tentatively plan to have some sports physical appointments available during the month of August. We will include this updated information in the August Newsletter.

SPORTS PHYSICALS

School sports physicals are required yearly and only for those students participating in middle school (including 6th grade) and high school sports. Physical examinations conducted before May 1st are not valid for participation for the following school year. The pre-participation physical exam form, which must be completed and accompany the student at the time of the physical, can be downloaded from the MHSA website under Resources/Forms/Miscellaneous.

There are also helpful links on the Billings Public School website: billingsschools.org If you Click on the "Departments" tab, and then "Activities".

You can then click on the link for "Billings Clinic sports physicals" or "Children's Clinic sports physicals".

You may get a sports physical at any health care provider you choose but the examination must be certified by a licensed medical professional acting within the scope and limitations of his/her practice. Please note: Physical exams must be completed prior to the first practice. Completed forms should be turned in to the school where they will be participating/attending.

Medicine Crow Middle School is also very lucky to have the Riverstone Clinic in our building who can complete Sports Physicals. You can call them at 247-3210 to make an appointment.

Again, these must be completed each school year, before the student is able to participate or practice in any sport. Please bring the completed form to our office.
