LEARNER OBJECTIVES

ART PRODUCTION

- 1. Student will create 2-D and 3-D works with a variety of media by:
 - a. exploring pencil, charcoal, oil pastel, pen & ink.
 - b. painting using watercolor, tempera, and /or acrylics.
 - c. working with mixed media and collage.
 - d. using print making techniques.
- 2. Student will explore electronic media using computer design software and the Internet.
- 3. Student will demonstrate extended use and care of basic art materials and safety procedures.
- 4. Student will demonstrate progress in a variety of media and methods which include drawing, painting, print making, collage, and sculpture.
- 5. Student will develop their own ideas to create images based on themes, symbols, events and personal experiences.
- 6. Student will demonstrate technical knowledge and appropriate use of the formal elements and principles of design.
- 7. Student will explore and use color theory through painting, drawing and design.

ANALYZE AND RESPOND TO WORKS OF ART

- 8. Student will be able to recognize, identify, and apply the elements of design in a work of art: line, shape, color, form space, texture and value.
- 9. Student will be able to recognize, identify, and apply elements towards principles of design: Balance, harmony, unity, movement, rhythm, and emphasize pattern.
- 10. Student will be aware that each work of art is a unique expression of the individual.
- 11. Student will view exemplary artworks and reproductions.
- 12. Student will continue to expand art vocabulary through writing, speaking, discussions, and presenting original work.
- 13. Student will incorporate observations of the man-made and natural environment into artwork through field trips and electronic media.
- 14. Student will observe how art reflects the personal experiences of the artist and engage in discussions exploring issues, feelings and ideas through critiques and discussion.

HISTORICAL AND CULTURAL

- 15. Student will understand art history as a visual record of art from past to present.
- 16. Student will create an art form reflecting a different culture.
- 17. Student will increase understanding of cultural diversity through exposure to cultures through reproductions, videos, CD Rom and the Internet.

- 19. Student will develop connections with art and other disciplines in a meaningful context through cross-curricular projects.
